Takangshan In the Takangshan of south Taiwan there live two Vinaya observing Bhiksus. One is called Ven. Chanyuen and another is called Ven. Taohsuan. The former is forty-one years old and the latter is less than thirty. Formerly on the mainland of China they had followed Ven. Chihchou, the famous Maha Thera of Vinaya Sect. When they came to Taiwan they built two simple sheds there to carry out their painstaking trainings. Ven. Chanyuen's appearance is very magnificent. His walking, stopping, sitting, leaning and even one movement are all well done according to Vinaya. He is respected by everyone and is called a teacher of teaching by doing. Ven. Taohsuan is a pain forbearable one, who wears a poor robe all year round. He is a very good Darma preacher. He has many thousand disciples irrespecting of his young age. He has built a Lotus Club in Kaohsung.

The two Bhiksus are now living their tranquil life in summer for three months according to Buddha's teachings. Our chief editor visited them on ninth last month accompanied by Mr. C. J. Wang, our editor on pictorial section. They lived in the Lungyan Vihara (the House of Dragon Stone) of Ven. Chanyuen which is a little larger than Ven. Taohsuan's hut. Our chief editor joined the tranquil life for five days by rising early, salute the Buddha image, meditating Buddha and observing the eight Silas. The two Bhiksus eat once in the noon everyday. They are all in good heath and happy. That time was the productive period of longan and our chief editor ate very many of the nutritious fruit.
